

If you are planning to take classes in summer 2018 at Lakeland Community College, you may be eligible to receive financial aid. For Lakeland to determine your aid eligibility you must:

- Complete the 2018-2019 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.gov; Lakeland will receive the results of your FAFSA in 3-5 business days.
- Check your Lakeland email regularly; you will be emailed if there is any additional information needed to process your financial aid.
- Register for summer classes; after you register, allow 3-5 business days for financial aid for summer to be awarded and for you to be able to view your summer award online through myLakeland.

Your summer financial aid eligibility will be calculated using your enrollment as of the freeze date (end of the 100% refund period) of your earliest class. For example, if you plan to take one class in the first summer session, one class in the second summer session and one class in the full summer session, you must register for all your classes before the first summer session freeze date (May 23). Your aid will not be adjusted if you add a class after your summer freeze date.

At Lakeland the summer semester is part of the 2018-2019 aid year. New federal regulations allow for increased Pell Grant eligibility within an aid year (Year Round Pell). If eligible, you may now attend full-time (12 or more credits) for the summer, fall, and spring semester and receive your full-time Pell grant eligibility for all three semesters.

You must be seeking a degree or eligible certificate at Lakeland to be eligible for summer financial aid. In addition, you must have attended during the 2017-2018 aid year or plan on attending Lakeland in fall 2018. If you are seeking a degree from another college, contact the Financial Aid Office at that college to inquire how you may receive summer funding while attending Lakeland as a transient student.
